

2025 Publication Award Winner - Dr. Christopher Wickham

Comanches, Captives and Germans: Wilhelm Friedrich's Drawings from the Texas Frontier







Christopher J. Wickham is Professor of German Emeritus at the University of Texas at San Antonio. Wickham holds a Ph.D. (magna cum laude) from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, an M.Phil and B.A.(Hons) from the University of Reading in the U.K.. From 2004 to 2013 he served as Associate Dean in the College of Liberal and Fine Arts at UTSA.

Wickham and Daniel J. Gelo were awarded the Presidio La Bahia Award for best book on early Texas history for *Comanches and Germans on the Texas Frontier*. For *Comanches, Captives, and Germans* they and their co-authors, Hoppy Hopkins and Bryden Moon, were awarded the 2023 Ed Mergele Book Award of the Genealogical Society of Kendall County.
